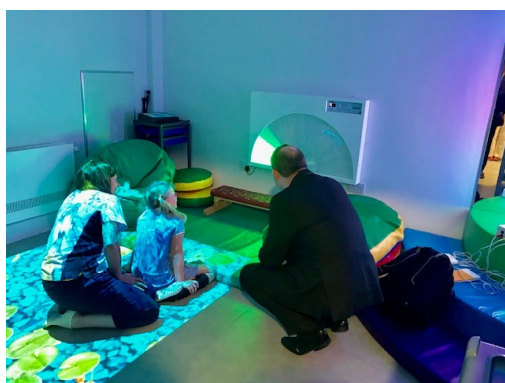
## NHS England visit, Treat me Well campaign, and appeal for sharing memories for the 70th birthday of the NHS

## Celebrating Learning Disability Awareness week - 18 to 24 June 2018

Bexley and Bromley Learning Disability Teams will be holding an information day on the 19 June in the main reception of Queen Mary's Hospital to celebrate Learning Disability Awareness Week.
